Take 5 and other wellbeing resources for parents/carers and families

This week marks the start of 5 weeks where we will focus our morning pastoral time on the Take 5 approach to mental and emotional wellbeing. Please find attached a copy of the Take 5 leaflet for your own information.

Take 5 steps to wellbeing is an evidence-based public health message aimed at improving wellbeing. Based on the Five Ways to Wellbeing developed by the New Economics Foundation (NEF), these simple and effective messages are grounded in solid evidence and complement the both the EA and NHSCT's Health and wellbeing strategy.

After a year groups assemblies to revisit the Take 5 theme classes will have planned activities for class assembly time to explore the 5 themes in more depth in their form class groups over the coming weeks.

The Take 5 approach has long been part of our work in school: a number of years back our Student Form worked with our business partner Westrock to produce a student-friendly, pocket sized leaflet. Work is in progress to update our pupil information to reflect the same symbols and terminology as the Health Service now uses in order to increase awareness and consistency.
